THREE WORLD PREMIERES HIGHLIGHT MAY 9TH CONCERT OF NEW MUSIC FOR YOUNG ENSEMBLES

Members of the Times Square Basstet and Friends will perform the world premieres of the 1982 co-winner, and the 1981 honorable mention winner of the New Music for Young Ensembles competition at its Spring concert in the Carnegie Recital Hall on Monday evening, May 9th at 8:00 p.m.

The six minute co-winning work, "Double Bass Quartet" by Eduardo Larin, was written specifically for entry into the NMYE competition. "A Baker's Tale" (1981 honorable mention), a ten minute work by David Snow, arranged for violin, clarinet, trumpet, bassoon, piano and narrator, will feature actor/singer Andy Thomas-Anselmo, and conductor Ainslee Cox.

Composer Milton Babbitt will make the award presentations to the two winners during the intermission.

Each year, New Music for Young Ensembles offers prizes and performances for accessible works of 10 minutes or shorter, to be performed by ensembles of every instrumental mixture within a chamber music scope. Also included on the program are a world premiere of "Five Duets for Clarinet and Violin" by Robert Starer, a second performance of "Tromba Marina" written for the Times Square Basstet by Jacob Druckman, and the rarely performed "Les Chansons de Bilitis" by Claude Debussy with Janet Bookspan as narrator.

In a special guest appearance, jazz bassist Milt "The Judge" Hinton will join the Times Square Basstet in the performance of "The Judge Meets the Section" composed by Mr. Hinton and arranged by Dick Hyman.

Friend artists appearing in the program will be David Krakauer, clarinet; Susan Jolles, harp; Alyssa Hess, harp; Sue Ann Kahn, flute; Karl Kraber, flute; Aleck Karis, piano/celeste; Ik Huan Bae, violin, and Lauren Goldstein, bassoon.
