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N.M.Y.E PRIZE-WINNING WORKS TO BE PRESENTED AT TANGLEWOOD

Two compositions which have received awards in the New Music for Young Ensembles Composition Competition during the last eight years will be heard in a chamber music concert of the Boston University Tanglewood Institute's Young Artists Instrumental program in conjunction with The Berkshire Music Center on Saturday, August 6, 1983, at 2:30 pm.
