ABOUT THE COMPOSERS

FELIX COX Born 1954-started composing in 1969.

In music program at Furman U he organized programs of students and composers and wrote music for school productions.

Teachers include: H. Merrills Lewis, George L. Hitt and Charlotte R. Smith.

Awards: First prize in 1980 and fourth place in 1982 and 84 in the Helen Hoback Competition.

Among performances are presentations by the Choirs of the Uni. Baptist and Mt. Vernon Methodist Churches, and Organ works given by William S. Partridge and Stephen O. Smith, organists.

RANDALL SCOTT EVANS

Age 23, from Erie, Pennsylvania, Randall is in his third year of study at the Peabody Institute with Morris Cotel.

Awards: Barroned Award and a Peabody Scholarship.Third prize in 1984 Helen Hoback Competition.

DAVID SNOW Wasborn in 1954. He has studied composition at Eastman, Yale and Brandies U. Teachers include: Samuel Adler, Joseph Schwantner, and Jacob Druckman.

Awards: from Eastman, Yale, A.S.C.A.P., B.M.I. and others. Helen Hoback third prize in 1981, first in 1983 and 84. Some of his published works are "Brass Quintet' (Seesaw Music, N.Y. 1977) "String Trio" (Peer- Southern Organization 1981) "Sonatina" for trumpet and piano (Dorn Music, Inc. Needham, MA 1981).

Named in memory of its founder, Helen Wakefield Hoback a charter member of the Baltimore Alumnae Chapter, 19-62.

In 1967 through the efforts of *A*ary Kemble, then president of the Baltimore Chapter, the Annapolis Fine Arts Association assumed a co-sponsorship role thus expanding the scope and importance of the contest. Originally limited to composers "under thirty", a new category with a special Baltimore Alumnae prize for composers over thirty years of age has been added at the suggestion of the present chairman, Eugenia Hommel.
