Artistic director of the NYU New Music and Dance Ensemble, the group maintains its residence at the University during the season and in Pisa, Italy during the summers. She has recorded for companies including Musical Heritage, Capriccio Records, CDCM-Centaur/Computer Music, Music and Arts, CRI, Opus One, Capstone and Romeo/Qualiton.
